### **Standing Committee**

Minutes

of the meeting held by videoconference on 7 May 2020

#### 1. OPENING OF THE MEETING

Mr Rik Daems, President of the Assembly, opened the meeting at 12 noon.

#### 2. AGENDA

The revised draft agenda was **adopted**.

#### 3. CHANGES IN THE MEMBERSHIP OF COMMITTEES

The Standing Committee **ratified** the change in the membership of the Committee on the Honouring of Obligations and Commitments by Member States of the Council of Europe (Monitoring Committee), as set out in document Commissions (2020) 05.

#### 4. **REFERENCES TO COMMITTEES**

AS/Per (2020) 04 parts 1 and 2

**The President** referred to document AS/Per (2020) 04 part 1, which contained all the decisions taken by the Bureau at its morning meeting on the action to be taken on the motions for resolutions that had been tabled.

The Secretary General of the Parliamentary Assembly said that, in accordance with the guidelines for consideration of motions for resolutions and recommendations, if a decision taken by the Bureau was successfully challenged in the Assembly or in the Standing Committee, the motion concerned would be referred back to the Bureau for reconsideration. If not, it would be ratified.

**Mr Nemeth** expressed surprise at the decision to take no further action on the motion for a resolution on "Reestablishing sustainable living conditions for autochthonous communities in balance with their natural environments in member states" (Doc. 15072 – item 7) as it highlighted the dangers faced by autochthonous communities relating to damage to the natural environment. The Bureau should reconsider its decision.

**Mr Maniero** asked the Bureau to reconsider its decision on the motion for a resolution on "Artificial intelligence and climate change" (Doc. 15068 – item 3). The motion should be referred to the Committee on Social Affairs, Health and Sustainable Development for report and not simply forwarded for information, as it was a highly topical and fundamental issue that deserved to be dealt with in depth.

**The President** said that there were seven reports on artificial intelligence currently being drafted in committees and that the Bureau had taken the view that the existing referrals already covered the full range of the problem.

**Ms Stienen** emphasised the need to interpret as broadly as possible the scope of the future report on "Women's rights must withstand the COVID-19 crisis" (item 18), with due regard for the terms of reference of the Committee on Equality and Non-Discrimination.

**Mr Tolstoi** asked for the decision on the motion for a resolution on the "Impact of armed conflicts on transboundary environmental damage" (Doc. 15074 – item 9) to be postponed as this was not an urgent issue. **Ms Yashko** formally objected to this and said that on the contrary, this motion raised a fundamental problem which should be dealt with without delay.

**Ms Trisse** commented that the list of references was rather extensive and wondered whether the committees would have time to deal with them and produce reports within the deadlines laid down. Priority should be given above all to the most urgent issues.

**The President** proposed ratifying en bloc the decisions to refer for report, to transmit for information or to take no further action, with the exception of the decisions on items 3, 7 and 9, which would be put to the vote. Members were asked to vote using the "messaging" button and to vote "yes" if they wished to refer the decision back to the Bureau, "no" if they ratified the Bureau's decision, or to state that they were abstaining.

This was **agreed**.

Commissions (2020) 05

AS/Per (2020) OJ 04 rev

Following a vote, the Standing Committee **decided** not to ratify the decision on the motion for a resolution on "Artificial intelligence and climate change" and to refer it back to the Bureau of the Assembly (item 3) (by 13 votes in favour of referral back to the Bureau, 13 votes against and 5 abstentions, with the President giving his casting vote in favour).

Following a vote, the Standing Committee **decided** to ratify the decision on the motion for a resolution on "Reestablishing sustainable living conditions for autochthonous communities in balance with their natural environments in member states" (item 7) (by 13 votes against the referral back to the Bureau, 11 votes in favour and 6 abstentions).

Following statements by **Ms Yashko**, **Mr Seyidov**, who supported the Bureau's decision to refer the proposal to the Committee on Social Affairs, Health and Sustainable Development for report in view of the importance of the issue, stressing that this was not a political issue, and **Mr Vardanyan** who said that this issue had legal implications and required consensus, and therefore proposed that the decision be referred back to the Bureau, the Standing Committee **decided** to ratify the decision on the motion for a resolution on the "Impact of armed conflicts on transboundary environmental damage" (item 9) (by 21 votes against the referral back to the Bureau, with 3 votes in favour and 5 abstentions).

Following a statement by **Mr Vardanyan**, who asked that the latter report be referred to the Committee on Legal Affairs and Human Rights for opinion, **the President** said that once Bureau decisions had been ratified by the Standing Committee, they could no longer be changed and were final. In addition, the decision taken by the Bureau at its meeting on 30 April 2020 to extend by six months the validity of all current references to committees would also apply to the references ratified at the present meeting.

#### 5. OTHER BUSINESS

**Ms Yashko** expressed her keen interest in the President's initiative, #PACEVoices, and encouraged members to share their ideas, experiences and reactions.

**Ms Stienen** referred to the online discussion held on 5 May by the Committee on Equality and Non-Discrimination on violence against women during lockdown and urging governments to apply the Istanbul Convention, which had been a success. This example of a carefully prepared remote hearing, with informative content, made for very insightful exchanges and could be an example to follow by other committees.

**Sir Roger Gale** wished to thank the secretariat for the perfect organisation of the day's meetings; **Mr Pociej** also congratulated the President on his chairing of the meetings.

#### 6. NEXT MEETING

The Standing Committee **decided** to hold its next meeting by videoconference on 26 June 2020.

The meeting **rose** at 12.50 pm.
