Mandate of the General Rapporteur on violence against women¹

Denomination: General Rapporteur on violence against women.

Term of office: one year renewable, subject to a maximum of two years.

Subject: it is the duty of the General Rapporteur on violence against women to intervene in the area of violence against women, in all its different forms, including domestic violence, particularly as regards the prevention of violence against women, protection of and assistance to victims, prosecution of the perpetrators and integrated policies.

Responsibilities: the General Rapporteur contributes to raising awareness on the phenomenon of violence against women, following relevant developments in Council of Europe member states and promoting the Council of Europe Convention on preventing and combating violence against women and domestic violence (Istanbul Convention). He or she shall report periodically to the committee on the information collected and the action taken.

The General Rapporteur on violence against women also ensures the political co-ordination of the PACE Parliamentary Network Women Free from Violence.

In addition, the role of the General Rapporteur is to:

- follow activities and maintain working relations with relevant Council of Europe bodies dealing with violence against women, including those which may be set up in this context;
- follow activities and maintain working relations with external bodies and institutions active in the same area, be they governmental or non-governmental organisations;
- represent the committee on behalf of the Assembly vis-à-vis the Committee of the Parties to the Istanbul Convention;
- follow up the relevant Assembly resolutions, in particular Resolution 2306 (2019) on "obstetrical and gynaecological violence", Resolution 2289 (2019) on "The Istanbul Convention on violence against women: achievements and challenges", Resolution 2274 (2019) and Recommendation 2152 (2019) on "Promoting parliaments free of sexism and sexual harassment", Resolution 2233 (2018) on "Forced marriage in Europe", Resolution 2177 (2017) on "Putting an end to sexual violence and harassment of women in public space" and Resolution 2159 (2017) on "Protecting refugee women from gender-based violence".
