Synopsis 2004/136

The Committee on Rules of Procedure and Immunities, meeting in Stockholm (Sweden) on 10 – 11 December 2004 with Mr Holovaty in the Chair:

as regards

- Challenge of credentials of individual members of a national delegation on substantive grounds (Rapporteur: Mr Magnusson, Sweden, SOC): invited the rapporteur to present a draft report at the next meeting;

- Request for participatory status of the European Federation of Research and Information Centres on Sectarism (FECRIS): approved an opinion to the Bureau of the Parliamentary Assembly regarding the procedure followed by the Committee on Legal Affairs and Human Rights on the FECRIS request.

- Defence of the immunity of Senator Raffaele lannuzzi (Rapporteur: Mr Jurgens, Netherlands, SOC): in the absence of the rapporteur, held a brief exchange of views and authorised the rapporteur to make direct contacts with Mr lannuzzi and the Italian authorities in Rome;

- Initiation of a monitoring procedure and post-monitoring dialogues (Rapporteur: Mr Gross, Switzerland, SOC): considered and approved a draft report and adopted a preliminary draft resolution, to be submitted to the Standing Committee (18 March 2005, Paris);

- Revision of the Terms of reference of Assembly committees (Rapporteur: Mrs Brasseur, Luxembourg, LDR): considered and approved a draft report and adopted a preliminary draft resolution, to be submitted to the January 2005 Assembly session;

- Institutional balance in the Council of Europe (Rapporteur: Mr Holovaty, Ukraine, LDR): held an exchange of views on an outline report, presented by the rapporteur and invited him to revise it; in this context agreed, because of the importance of the matter, to appoint an expert;

- Procedure for elections of judges to the European Court of Human Rights and of the Council of Europe Commissioner for Human Rights (Rapporteur: Mr Vis, United Kingdom, SOC): considered and approved a revised draft report and adopted a preliminary draft resolution, to be submitted to the Standing Committee (18 March 2005, Paris);

- *Membership of the immediate past President in the Political Affairs Committee (Rule 18.3.), Rapporteur: Mr Magnusson, Sweden, SOC:* postponed the discussions on the draft report to its next meeting;

- Amendment N° 7 concerning the draft resolution on the monopolisation of the electronic media and possible abuse of power in Italy : held an exchange of views on a draft memorandum, presented by its Chairman, and approved an opinion to the Bureau of the Parliamentary Assembly;

- Seminar on "The role of the opposition in a democratic parliament", 10 – 11 December 2004, Stockholm (Sweden): held a seminar with the participation of parliamentarians from the following <u>national</u> parliaments: Albania, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Czech Republic, France, Italy, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Moldova, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Spain, Ukraine and United Kingdom; in this context, approved the Concluding remarks, presented by Mr Magnusson (Sweden, SOC), 1st Vice-Chairman of the Committee;

- Appointed the following rapporteurs:

Mr Manzella (Italy, SOC) on Assembly rules on current affairs and urgent debates;

Mrs Samoilovska-Cvetanova ("the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia", EPP/CD) on the Composition (number of seats) of the Committee on Equal Opportunities for Women and Men;

- decided to meet during the next part-session of the Assembly (24-28 January 2005 in Strasbourg).
