of the meeting held in Strasbourg and by videoconference on 21 April 2021

The Committee on Rules of Procedure, Immunities and Institutional Affairs, meeting in Strasbourg, on 21 April 2021, with Ms Ingjerd Schou (Norway, EPP/CD) in the Chair, as regards:

- Budgets and priorities of the Council of Europe for the period 2022-2025 and Expenditure of the Parliamentary Assembly for the biennium 2022-2023 (General rapporteur: Mr Tiny Kox, Netherlands, UEL): considered and approved two reports and adopted a draft opinion and a draft resolution, in view of their presentation at the May 2021 Standing Committee;

(in camera) Alleged breaches of the Code of conduct for members of the Parliamentary Assembly
Complaint concerning Mr Oleksii Goncharenko (Ukraine, EC/DA): in accordance with the Assembly's rules and the committee's procedure, heard Mr Goncharenko, took note of his written comments, and decided to continue its deliberation and postpone the decision to its next meeting.
